Focuses on Christ's eternal reign and his love for righteousness. His throne is forever, and his scepter is one of uprightness.

Ephesians 1:22

Describes Christ as the supreme authority, with all things under his feet. This aligns with Hebrews' focus on his eternal throne and righteous scepter.


Christ's role in enabling believers' adoption as sons (Ephesians 1:5)
