Christ as Supreme Son

Hebrews 1:5

God declares Christ His Son.

Colossians 1:15

Christ as image of invisible God.

Significance

Establishes Christ's unique divine status.

Divine Nature of Christ

1 Hebrews 1:8

Son addressed as God.

2 Colossians 2:9

Fullness of deity dwells in Christ.

3 Implication

Christ's divinity central to both epistles.





Christ's Role in Creation

Pre-existence

Christ before all things (Col. 1:17).

Creation

All created through Christ (Col. 1:16).

3 Sustenance

Christ upholds universe (Heb. 1:3).

Eternal Reign of Christ

1

Anointed

God sets Christ above all (Heb. 1:9).

2

Enthroned

Eternal throne established (Heb. 1:8).

Kingdom

Believers transferred to Christ's kingdom (Col. 1:13).

Christ's Righteousness

Love for Justice

Christ loves righteousness, hates wickedness (Heb. 1:9).

Reconciliation

Christ makes peace through cross (Col. 1:20).

Transformation

Believers made holy through Christ (Col. 1:22).





Mystery of Christ Revealed



Hidden Wisdom

Mystery concealed for ages (Col. 1:26).



Revelation

Now made manifest to saints (Col. 1:26).



Fullness

All wisdom and knowledge in Christ (Col. 2:3).
